## **BIOLOGY 440: Outline for Critical Review.**

- Use *Trends in Ecology & Evolution* as a guide for both format and scope of a critical review.
- Outline should be 2 pages, double-spaced, 12-pt font.
- **Provide a provisional/working title** (e.g. *Is there conflicting evidence for the Cambrian Explosion from the paleontological and fossil record?*).
- Make sure to clearly provide a broad segue into your essay (i.e. anchoring your critical review within the broad panoply of evolutionary biology), summarize background that is relevant to your paper, and state what the major issues that you are addressing are. For example, if you were tackling "secondary reinforcement". You might suggest something to the effect that:
  - despite decades of work the remain several key important issues in our understanding of mechanisms of speciation.
  - broad agreement that many speciation events begin with range fragmentation.
  - theory & empirical evidence for reproductive character displacement and reinforcement only in last decade.
  - outstanding issues still with how selection against hybrids in a contact zone can spread outward into each parental species.
  - few unequivocal empirical examples.
  - My review will discuss: i. the new developments that might surmount theoretical objections to reinforcement, ii. the evidence that must be forthcoming to unequivocally diagnose secondary reinforcement, and iii. the empirical evidence pro and con its existence and frequency.
- Use subheadings to provide an overview of essay structure.
